



Instructions for Tariff Applications

Net Energy Metered (NEM) customer with systems designed to produce no more than their historical annual energy consumption at the host site will be automatically enrolled into that tariff once the interconnection application process is complete with Delmarva Power. Other types of tariff requests will require you to apply for interconnection with PJM Interconnection. Thus, instead of interconnection applications with Delmarva Power, there are tariff applications that need to be filled out and approved for enrollment into those tariffs:

- NEM 100-110%: For systems that are designed to generate from between greater than 100% and less than or equal to 110% of the historical annual energy consumption of the account of the host site, which is allowed by Delaware Regulation use the NEM 100-110% tariff application to become an NEM customer with DPL. This will ask you for your contact information and some information about your renewable energy facility. A PJM Queue Number can be submitted with the application, but will be required within 90 days after you submit the form. You are required to sign and once DPL is notified by you that construction is complete and DPL confirms completion, and exchanges the meter(s), we will sign and return our portion of the ANEM tariff application and will change your status in our system.
- ANEM: For system(s) that are designed and built to offset both the host and other accounts for a single customer/owner, use the Aggregated Net Energy Metering (ANEM) tariff application. This form will ask you for contact information and some information about the renewable energy facility or facilities. It will also ask for a list of accounts in the order to be aggregated. A PJM Queue Number can be submitted with the application, but will be required within 90 days after you submit the form. You are required to sign and once DPL is notified by you that construction is complete and DPL confirms completion, and exchanges the meter(s), we will sign and return our portion of the ANEM tariff application and will change your status in our system.
- CEF: For systems designed and built to offset other customers' accounts, use the Community Energy facility (CEF) tariff application. This form will ask you for some information about the CEF corporate business, contact information, banking information, and information on the renewable energy facility. It will also ask for a Statement of Qualification describing how the CEF is a community of customers sharing a unique set of interests. Also required on the form are names, account numbers, addresses, and signatures of the participating subscribers to the CEF. DPL will send confirmation letters to the subscribers. A PJM Queue Number can be submitted with the application, but will be required within 90 days after you submit the form. An authorized CEF representative is required to sign. Once DPL is notified by the CEF that construction is complete and DPL confirms completion and installs/exchanges the meter(s), we will sign and return our portion of the CEF tariff application and will change your status in our system.
