

COSTS TO COMPLY WITH DELAWARE'S RENEWABLE ENERGY PORTFOLIO STANDARDS ACT

For the period June 1, 2020 through May 31, 2021

Delmarva Power incurs and recovers costs in compliance with a Delaware law known as the Renewable Energy Portfolio Standards Act ("Act"). Beginning on June 1, 2012, Delmarva Power was required to assume responsibility for meeting the obligations of the Act for all customers in Delaware, including those who purchase their electricity from third party suppliers. Compliance with the Act is achieved through the use of renewable energy sources, such as solar and wind generation, as well as energy output produced by a qualified fuel cell provider project, and through purchasing credits for renewable and clean energy generation.

The Act requires that the electricity portfolio used to supply Delaware customers include a minimum percentage of renewable energy sources each year. On February 10, 2021, the Act was amended and Delaware's prior renewable energy requirement of 25% by 2025 was increased to a new requirement of 40% (including 10% of which must come from solar generation) by 2035.

The following information reflects the total costs recovered, to meet the requirements of the Act for the period June 1, 2020 through May 31, 2021. These costs do not reflect reductions for economic or health benefits from the use of renewable and clean energy sources. The costs collected through the Renewable Compliance Charge for compliance year June 1, 2020 through May 31, 2021 were \$67 million.
